



## Earn Academic Credit on CIEE's Global Navigator High School Study Abroad

**Tulane University: CIEE School of Record** High school participants may earn academic credit through top-ranked Tulane University while studying abroad with CIEE. Tulane serves as the official CIEE School of Record for our Global Navigator Language & Culture summer abroad programs.

**What is a School of Record?** CIEE partners with a School of Record to award and validate academic credit to study abroad students. A School of Record is fully accredited and able to evaluate, document, and award credits for courses taken at non-U.S. accredited institutions.

**How Does the Process Work?** College credits may be used to apply toward a student's future college degree, to demonstrate their ability to do college-level work, or to test out of a language level in college. Interested high school students should follow these steps:

- **Step 1:** Pick their favorite Global Navigator Language & Culture summer abroad program and elect the "college credit" option in their completed application.
- **Step 2:** Pay the \$100 non-refundable transcript fee to CIEE and sign the School of Record waiver before 5/15/16.
- **Step 3:** Complete program and receive a grade for work completed.
- **Step 4:** CIEE/Tulane will award official transcripts at the end of the program. (All grades are transferred to Tulane University).
- **Step 5:** Students submit the official transcripts to their college of choice. (College credit transfers are contingent upon the policies of the college in which you enroll. While not guaranteed, the CIEE/Tulane transcript is considered fully accredited.)
