Notes on College Exploration for the B-C Student

- Encourage looking at schools outside of MD
- Look for liberal academic/test score requirement
- Check www.fairtest.org for schools that don't require test scores
- Try the ACT test – register at www.act.org
- Investigate community college – after 30 credits you don't have to send test scores
- Questions for the student to ask:
 - Can I be successful at this school?
 - What is the college's admit rate?
 - Ask for an interview?
 - Can I transfer to a "better" college after a year?
 - For Students with Disabilities: What accommodations will be offered?
 - Is there a foreign language requirement?
- Check for automatic admissions schools
- Try for the "general studies" major – sometimes can be less competitive
- With rolling admission, sometimes getting the application in earlier can reduce the amount of competitive applicants that you go up against
- Utilize personal disclosure section to discuss adverse circumstances that have impacted GPA – but make sure to disclose how the student has gotten back on track
